

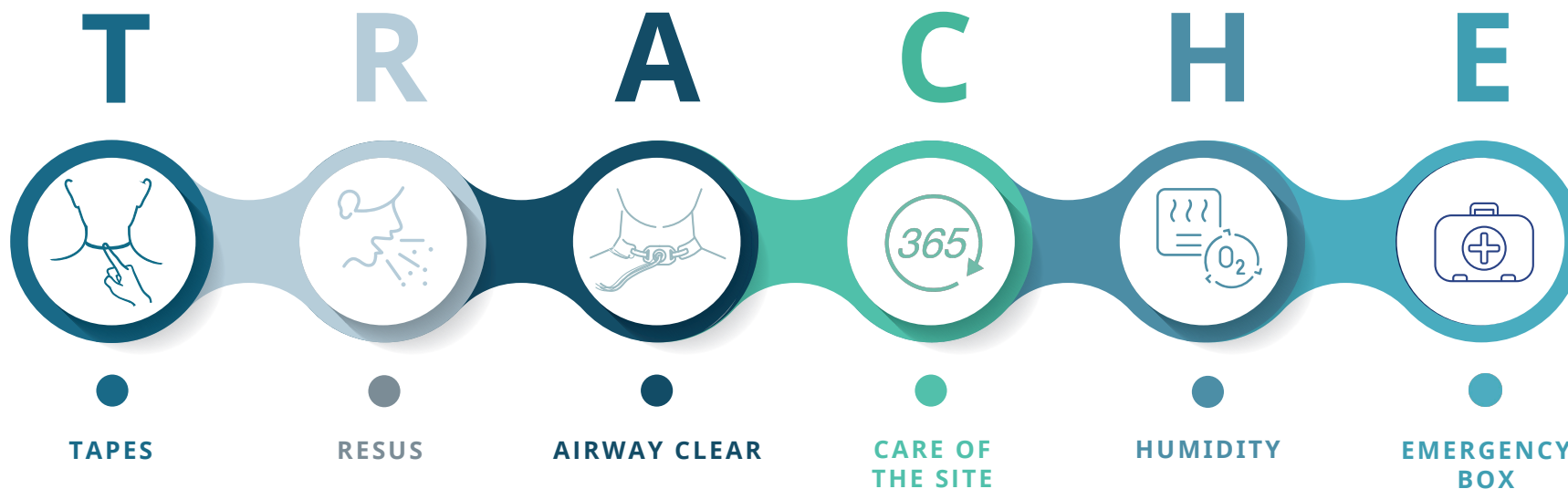

The TRACHE Checklist

The simple steps to look after a child with a Tracheostomy in hospital

Paediatrics
In hospital



Ensure tension of tapes is tight enough to **keep tube secure**.

One finger should fit comfortably between the child's neck and the tapes.

Scan the QR code to find out more about the resuscitation process

Know the resuscitation process: **S**afety, **S**timulate, **S**hout for help, **S**uction

Use correct catheter size and length, only suctioning **just beyond** the end of the child's tube.

The catheter size should be double the size of the tube, e.g. 8 FG catheter for a 4.0 ID tube.

The stoma and neck should be cleaned **at least daily**, and any skin breakdown **noted and treated**.

Don't forget the back of the neck!

Additional **humidification is essential to keep the tube clear**.

Use most **appropriate method** to suit patient need; either a water system or Heat and Moisture Exchanger (HME/ Swedish nose)
