## The TRACHE Checklist

The simple steps to look after a child with a Tracheostomy in hospital





Ensure tension of tapes is tight enough to keep tube secure.

One finger should fit comfortably between the child's neck and the tapes.

**Know** the resuscitation process: Safety, Stimulate, Shout for help, **S**uction

Scan the QR code to find out more about the resuscitation process Use correct catheter size and length, only suctioning **just beyond** the end of the child's tube.

The catheter size should be double the size of the tube. e.g. 8 FG catheter for a 4.0 ID tube.

The stoma and neck should be cleaned at least daily, and any skin breakdown noted and treated.

Don't forget the back of the neck!

Additional humidification is essential to keep the tube clear.

Use most appropriate method to suit patient need; either a water system or Heat and Moisture Exchanger (HME/ Swedish nose)

Ensure emergency box is **always** present and contains the correct equipment
